- Flint, MI was home with three brothers and a sister. My parents' farm had milking cows, pigs, geese, and 100's of chickens. We milked, sold eggs and meat, and worked very hard.
- Farm chores before and after school instilled a strong work ethic. Driving the pick-up truck at age 10 sparked my adventurous spirit. Let's say there were days the drive to school took a detour or hitchhiking provided travel opportunities to multiple states prior high school graduation.
- I never enjoyed sitting in a classroom. I preferred physical activity after school. Soccer in grade school; Football (defensive lineman) and basketball in high school.
- My mother raised 100's of chickens. A restaurant call at 2 pm requiring 30 chickens for the evening menu required immediate family action.
- Planted 2,000 apple trees to create an orchard after my parents sold the farm animals. That changed the landscape and my job responsibilities at home.
- Growing up my dad purchased a large picnic table for our kitchen. I can see Mom baking bread, rolls and biscuits and placing them on that table to cool. The table continues to be a family heirloom today and sits in the home of my niece.
- I met my wife when she transferred into my high school during the 11th grade. We raised a daughter and son in Grand Blanc, MI.
- I worked as a teamster truck driver for 30 years, did heavy excavating, and remodeled homes. Winters in Florida, Arizona and travels to Europe plus seeking ancestry in Ireland was fun.
- In July, I will celebrate my 2nd anniversary of moving to the Gardens.
