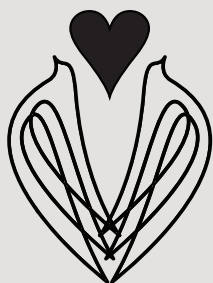

## Mission Message

St. Francis once said, "The Lord has called me into the way of simplicity and humility, and he has indeed made this

way known through me and through all who choose to believe me and follow me." Eight hundred years later, there are still so many in this world who are affected by the model that St. Francis offered to us. Those who read his words and follow his way are following in the path that Jesus walked, because that is where Francis leads us: straight to Jesus.

As we start this new year, we are filled with goals and aspirations. But maybe the message of Francis is the one to take most to heart. Simplicity. Humility. What a world we would have if everyone followed that model! What do you hope to make room for next year in your life? Not so much as a resolution, but as a holy invitation? What if it's not about losing weight and getting physically healthy, but more about our spiritual health? Inviting ourselves and others to deepen our love of God can bring us into the new year with the joy we felt at Christmas.

We don't have to be perfect, and we probably can't be! That might help explain why resolutions so often fail by the end of January. If we can invite ourselves to be more present to others and to God, that can continue through the year. That is not an impossible task. Simplicity and humility offer us that pathway. We know that Jesus' disciples came from simple backgrounds for the most part. They had to learn humility along the way. They weren't perfect. They dedicated their lives to the work of Jesus. Francis also devoted his life to serving others as Jesus modeled for him. When he recreated the Nativity scene in Greccio, Italy, he wanted to bring that moment of the Incarnation to life, to remind people of the gift they had been given. He made himself present to the people. He spent time in prayer making himself present to God. Give it a try. Open yourself to the promise of God to make all things new.
