One of the things I love about the Easter season is that we get to hear readings from the Acts of the Apostles each Sun-

Lent presented us with the opportunity to have a regular discipline of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Easter gives us the beautiful signs of going out and serving others in the footsteps of the apostles.
