Let's play "secret resident"

(As told by friend, Donna)

- Grew up in Manitowoc with her family of Mom, Dad, six sisters and one brother.
- When she was 18 she visited California and became aware of the thrill of flying. Watching the flight stewardess so skillfully handle her job she knew right then what she wanted to do.
- She came home, saved up money and in the fall of 1957 at 19 years old left for New York to find a school to train with to become a stewardess.
- For almost six months she lived in a rental facility with 28 girls with three rooms while she inquired with different airlines to become a stewardess.
- She wanted to, "fly in the friendly skies of the United States."
- In 1958, National Airlines flew her to Miami and she started an eight week course to become a stewardess. Her dream was coming true!
- She was hired with National Airlines to fly to Boston, New York and Washington.
- On May 1, 1961, when she boarded her flight to go to Key West she did not know her life was going to change from being a stewardess to being the most well-known stewardess of her time.
- That flight became the first flight crew ever hijacked in the United States. All passengers and flight crew members landed safely and unharmed.
- She was featured in pictures and news across the US and was a guest on the Art Linkletter show.
- On May 1, 2011, she was featured on the front page of the Herald Times Reporter, re-writing the story of the hijacked flight.

After months of planning, evaluation, and deliberation, the Felician Village 2025 Fiscal Year Budget (July 1 – June 30) was approved by the Board of Directors and Felician Services, Inc.

A significant piece of our budget negotiation was the obligation to meet the loan covenants to Felician Services, Inc. We passed a budget that



lessened your rent increases compared to last year while continuing to maintain and grow our services and capital spending advancements to our community. While that required us to find efficiencies through the re-organization of work functions, we expect our service quality to remain unchanged. We are proud to announce that we are overcoming wage, service, and expense inflation rates by giving a modest cost of living rent increase in this fiscal year budget.

It is an absolute pleasure to once again tell you that Felician Village was named the "Best of the Lakeshore" for the 15th year in a row! Felician Village was voted best Assisted/Senior Living, Memory Care, Nursing Home, Rehabilitation Facility, and Retirement/55+ Community. We were also voted a runner-up as one of the top workplaces in Manitowoc County. This is a testament to the hard work and dedication of all involved in our Felician Village Community.

I will be participating in the Walk to End Alzheimer's on Saturday, September 7th with our Felician Village team, and I hope that you can join me and my family in supporting this much-needed advocacy cause for our industry. The theme of this year's strategic plan and budget is centralized around effective change management and our core value of transformation. While change is difficult for many ministries, we are blessed with a special ability to champion it at Felician Village, having executed it for a rare 137 years and counting. St. Clare followed in the path of St. Francis, leading a Gospel life. She left her home, declining to be married to another noble person of the time, choosing instead to live in poverty, chastity, and obedience. Clare was a model for us in humility and care for others. Sr. Ramona Miller, OSF, notes, "Clare's commitment to follow in the footsteps of Jesus shaped her compassionate heart. She extended such care to others that they were healed of their afflictions."


