Remembrance and Prayer Service for the Pioneer Sisters

In 1874, Blessed Mary Angela Truszkowska sent five Felician Sisters across the Atlantic to North America. On November 21, 1874 they arrived in Polonia, WI, where the pastor of St. Joseph Parish, Fr. Joseph Dabrowski had requested their help educating the children of Polish immigrants. We have been celebrating these pioneer sisters all year, remembering their

work, their hardships, and their gifts of sharing the Gospel.

On August 27th, the 138th anniversary of Felician Village's ministry, a group gathered in the St. Mary's Cemetery – Sisters Section to hold a Remembrance and Prayer Service for the Pioneer Sisters and all Sisters. After the service, the group cleaned headstones of those who had served at St.Mary's/Felician Village. As of this year, over 320 Felician Sisters have served at this, their first ministry in North America, Felician Village. May they rest in peace. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

We keep celebrating in October with our Mission and Heritage Week. Let us recall with thanksgiving these Sisters who gave their all to be present to God and God's people.


