This marked a significant moment in our ministry's history, as we will be without Felician Sisters for the first time since our beginning in 1887. Felician Village will continue to carry out the work of the Sisters with the support of our more than 225 lay staff members and continued guidance from Felician Services, Inc. Our three remaining



Sisters, Sr. Bernadette, Sr. Bernetta, and Sr. Rosalie, were sent off to their retirement with blessings and love at a Farewell Celebration on July 10. We remain grounded in gratitude for their presence, ministry, and legacy of compassion and care.

Since 1887, the Felician Sisters have served in Manitowoc at Felician Village, originally called St. Mary's Home. They have provided a beautiful witness of dedication to the gospel message of caring for the most vulnerable. Their service to the community, including orphans, diocesan priests, Franciscan Friars, and the aging members of Manitowoc County, has provided warmth, love, and generous hospitality. They have brought the charism of Blessed Mary Angela Truskowska from Poland to North America in a complete and tangible manner. They have given life, nourishment, shelter, and care to generations of residents. They have welcomed lay people to share in their mission of continuing the healing ministry of Jesus by providing compassionate care that respects the dignity of each person they serve.

Stuffed with Love: Cuddly Companions Make a Heartwarming Impact

One of our most touching (literally!) grant awards received this year was for robotic companion animals. Last year Felician Village applied to the State of Wisconsin for funding of Furry Friends (through the Joyful Companion Pets program) for the benefit of our nursing home residents. The purpose of the animals is to engage with residents, and is especially helpful to those with dementia and decreased motor skills. We were awarded 27 mechanical pet residents; 18

dogs and 9 cats. The mechanics of the pets mimic real pets-they yawn,

wiggle their tails, meow and bark, and move their heads.

For some residents who grew up with dogs, it was an easy choice. For others who love both cats and dogs, they had a decision to make. A special bond has developed between human and pet companions. 
KEEP THE GOOD TIMES ROLLING

Turn Your IRA Into a Powerful Giving Tool

If you qualify, now is the time to make a gift through options that may be advantageous to you.

If you are 70.5 years old

You may donate directly from your Individual Requirement Account (IRA) to a qualified charity through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

2025 Annual Limit



\$108,000 per individual \$216,000 per couple

QCDs can satisfy part or all your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) while supporting a cause you care about.

If you are 73 years old in 2025

The IRS mandates that you must take annual withdrawals from your traditional retirement accounts. What better way to invest in charities while possibly reducing your tax liabilities?
