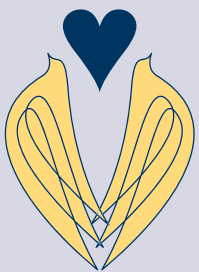

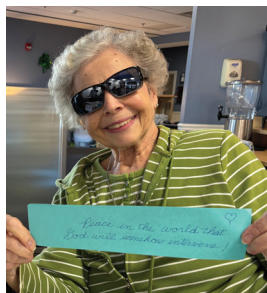
Bridging Generations, Building Memories

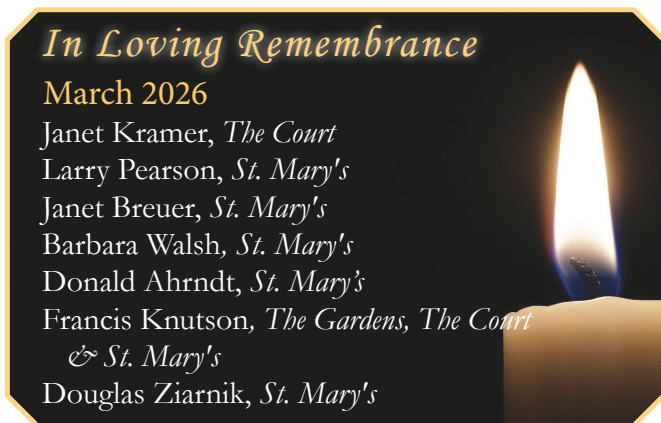

We have celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus with joyous Easter festivities. Our worship sings God's praises. We use the word "Alleluia" once again, after weeks of Lent.
