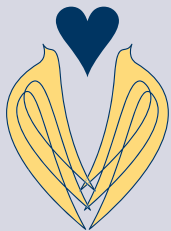

Mission Message

One of the things I love about the Easter season is that we get to hear readings from the Acts of the Apostles each Sunday.

Those readings take the place of what would, for the rest of the church year, be readings from the Old Testament. But for several weeks we focus on what the apostles did after Jesus' resurrection. We learn about their empowerment through the Holy Spirit to go out to preach among and serve God's people.

The apostles overcome obstacles to spread the Gospel message throughout the land. We learn about the Holy Spirit's empowerment, the growth and spread of the Church, the inclusion of Gentiles in the Christian faith, persecution and suffering faced by early Christians, and the significance of the Gospel message.

It's not just a nice history lesson, though. The experiences of the apostles' ministry show us that despite hurdles, we can share the word of God with others. We, too, are empowered through the Holy Spirit to act. Through our actions, we become the hands and feet of our Lord. Our care for those around us and for those far away demonstrates the love of God to all people. We are called to preach our faith through words and actions so that others might know of the Lord's goodness and generosity.

Lent presented us with the opportunity to have a regular discipline of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Easter gives us the beautiful signs of going out and serving others in the footsteps of the apostles.
