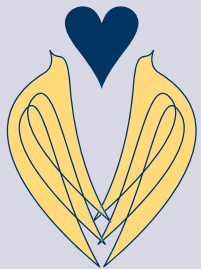

Recently, I had the opportunity to embark on a once-in-a-lifetime pilgrimage to Assisi and Rome, Italy, sponsored by Felician Services. I was joined by other Felician Ministry leaders as we visited many sacred places filled with history, culture, and spirituality. Throughout this pilgrimage, I found myself reflecting on the core values of the Felician Sisters that guide our work at Felician Village.



• **Solidarity with Those in Need:** Along my journey, I encountered people from all walks of life—some making their way with strength and joy, others with great difficulty. I was reminded of the importance of standing with those who are vulnerable, much as we do here in our community. Just as we strive to care for and support one another, this journey reaffirmed for me the significance of walking beside those in need, sharing their burdens, and offering comfort, however small.

• **Compassion:** Compassion was at the heart of every encounter I had during the pilgrimage. At Felician Village, we practice this compassion daily—whether it's through a friendly smile, a listening ear, or the care our team provides. At times it can be easy to get caught up in the challenges of the day, but it is compassion that holds us together and makes us stronger.

• **Transformation:** Pilgrimages are about transformation, centered around personal growth. I found myself reflecting on the fact that our lives are always changing. With each chapter, comes an opportunity for growth, for deeper understanding, and for inner transformation. This resonates deeply with the experiences we share in our senior living facility, where each day offers a chance for new beginnings, learning, and personal reflection.

• **Justice & Peace:** Just as we strive for peace within our ministry by treating each other fairly and with respect, my pilgrimage reminded me that true peace is only possible when justice is present. It is our collective responsibility to ensure that everyone at Felician Village is treated with fairness, dignity, and respect.

• **Respect for Human Dignity:** At the heart of the pilgrimage was an overwhelming respect for the dignity of each person I met. Regardless of their background, their faith, or their personal struggles, each person was treated with respect. This is a value we hold dearly in our ministry, where every resident, staff member, and visitor is treated with respect. It is a reminder that we must always honor the dignity of others in our interactions.

My pilgrimage was a journey not only across the beautiful countryside of Italy but through my heart and spirit. I returned with a renewed sense of gratitude for all that we share here—a ministry guided by the strong core values of the Felician Sisters, making a difference in the lives of all those we serve.
