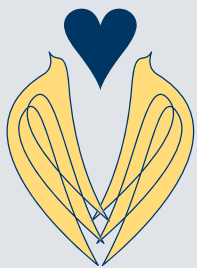

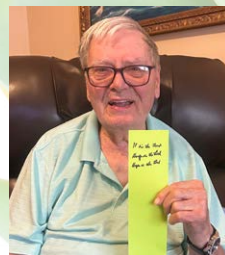
Without missing a beat, we leaned into our Franciscan spirit and said, "Bring that dog to work, just make sure we get a cute picture of him helping out." And she did.
