

In 1 John 3:18, we read, "Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth." Our faith is an active faith, not a passive one. We share the gospel in our words, but we really show our love through what we do. I enjoy hearing the stories of volunteers and why they choose

to give the gift of their time. For so many, service to the Lord through volunteering is not an additional thing they do, but a reflection of who they are as God's children. Our service allows us to know God more deeply and to love all of God's creation more fervently.

We learn that we have many gifts that can be shared, some we probably didn't even know about before we were asked to spend some time in service to others! Sharing those gifts builds our relationship with Jesus and with His children. Joy breaks out when we love in this manner. We become the visible instruments of God's love in a world that is so in need of our care.

1 Peter 4:10 tells us, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." We are called to this service! Isaiah (6:8) said, "Here am I, send me," and so did you! When I read the prophets, especially their stories where they are called by God into service, I imagine what it must have been like to say "yes" to God in their circumstances. Some said to God that they weren't the right one to do the job. Moses said he wasn't a great speaker. Jeremiah said he was too young. Isaiah said he was a man of unclean lips. Yet, they answered the call to serve. Imagine the group of women who followed God's call 150 years ago, coming to Wisconsin to respond to the needs of a Polish immigrant community! That must have been a difficult "yes" to say. The Felician Sisters offer a model for us of how beautiful it is to answer affirmatively when God reaches out to us to serve.

So, bless all of you who serve God's people. It's not easy! You give your time and sometimes you don't hear words of gratitude. But when you pour out your gifts for the care of others, you participate in the interconnected world that God created, showing your love. I pray that you are filled with delight and joy at the importance of sharing your gifts and resources. That you, who see the needs set before you, will find strength and courage to continue your work, is my hope. May you be blessed in all that you do, in loving God's children, in walking with Jesus, and in caring for all of creation.

#### MISSION SERVICES UPDATE

At the end of June, the three Felician Sisters currently residing at Felician Village in Manitowoc will be leaving the campus. This marks a significant moment in our ministry's history, as we will be without Felician Sisters for the first time since our beginning in 1887. Felician Village will continue to carry out the work of the Sisters with the support of our more than 225 lay staff members and continued guidance from Felician Services Incorporated. At this time, Sr. Bernadette, Sr. Bernetta, and Sr. Rosalie will be relocating. While we deeply feel the weight of this transition, we remain grounded in gratitude for their presence, ministry, and legacy of compassion and care.

Since 1887, the Felician Sisters have served in Manitowoc at Felician Village, originally called St. Mary's Home. They have labored and prayed to bestow peace, happiness, and comfort. Their work has been blessed. In these years, they have provided a beautiful witness of dedication to the gospel message of caring for the most vulnerable. Their service to the community, including orphans, diocesan priests, Franciscan friars, and the aging members of Manitowoc County has provided warmth, love, and generous hospitality. They have brought the charism of Blessed Mary Angela Truskowska from Poland to North America in a complete and tangible manner. The Sisters continued to carry on the traditions begun by their pioneer Sisters who arrived in North America 150 years ago. They have given life, nourishment, shelter, and care to generations of residents. They have welcomed lay people to share in their mission of continuing the healing ministry of Jesus by providing compassionate care that respects the dignity of each person they serve.

Opportunities to celebrate our Felician Sisters at Felician Village will be announced in the near future. Our ministry will faithfully welcome other Felician Sisters to serve our ministry in a day-to-day capacity if that opportunity presents itself in the future. Please keep our Sisters in your prayers.
